6. Recipients or categories of recipients to whom the data will be

6.1 Internal

Administrators and employees responsible for data processing

6.2 External

Other online course participants, instructors and teaching assistants, its own contractual partners, IT supervisors as well as external data-processing centres, authorities, courts and other agencies, national insurance agencies, banks for the purpose of payment processing.

7. Standard periods for the erasure of data

The German parliament has enacted numerous laws pertaining to data-retention duties and periods. Once these periods have elapsed, the corresponding data will be erased as a matter of routine if it is no longer required to comply with the contract. Where data is not subject to these regulations, it will be erased when the purposes for which it was obtained (see 2.1) cease to apply.

8. Planned data transmission in third countries

Data transmission in third countries arises in the context of the performance of a contract, essential communication and other exceptions expressly foreseen in the German Federal Data Protection Act. Otherwise there will be no transmission in third countries and no such transmission is planned.
